The recordings shall be maintained for a period of not less than ninety (90) days and shall be made available to law enforcement authorities upon request.

- 4. The medical marijuana transportation facility shall also have and provide an
   adequate fire-protected and secure room for storing any processed marijuana
   products.
- 5. The medical marijuana facility shall have a fire and burglar alarm system.

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- 5 6. The exterior building lighting and parking area of the medical marijuana facility shall be equipped with lighting fixtures of sufficient intensity to illuminate all interior areas of the lot with an illumination of not less than one and five tenths (1.5) footcandles evenly distributed as measured at floor level. These light fixtures shall be turned on from dusk to dawn.
  - 7. The medical marijuana facility shall not use any equipment or process that creates noise, dust, vibration, glare, fumes, odors or electrical interference detectable to the normal senses beyond the property boundary so as to create a public nuisance as defined by this Code or Missouri State Law.
  - No person or facility shall dispose of marijuana or marijuana-infused products in an unsecured waste receptacle not in possession and control of the licensee and designed to prohibit unauthorized access.
  - 9. Medical marijuana dispensary, cultivation and transportation facilities shall have an armed security guard on the premises at all times.
- 10. The medical marijuana facility shall display its State-issued license on the interior 20 of the facility, visible to the public, at all times.
- 21 11. The medical marijuana facility shall not allow on-site consumption of marijuana, 22 marijuana-infused products or other intoxicants on the premises at any given time.

1 12. The medical marijuana facility shall not have outdoor seating areas other than 2 break areas for employees of the facility.

- 13. The medical marijuana facility shall not have a sign unless it is a medical marijuana dispensary. Signage at medical marijuana dispensaries shall comply with Article XIII of the UDO.
- 14. Any and all cultivation, processing, storage, display, sales or other distribution of marijuana at a medical marijuana facility shall occur within an enclosed building and shall not be visible from the exterior of the building. If said facility is located outdoors, then the facility shall not be readily visible, and any outdoor area shall be enclosed and topped by a razor-wire fence. Said fence shall be slatted or other privacy-type fence used, and all fencing shall be at least ten (10) feet in height, not including the razor wire.

- fixtures shall be turned on from dusk to dawn.
- 7. The medical marijuana facility shall not use any equipment or process that creates
- noise, dust, vibration, glare, fumes, odors or electrical interference detectable to
- the normal senses beyond the property boundary so as to create a public nuisance
- as defined by this Code or Missouri State Law.
- 8. No person or facility shall dispose of marijuana or marijuana-infused products in
- an unsecured waste receptacle not in possession and control of the licensee and
- designed to prohibit unauthorized access.
- 9. Medical marijuana dispensary, cultivation and transportation facilities shall have
- an armed security guard on the premises at all times.
- 21 10. The medical marijuana facility shall display its State-issued license on the interior
- of the facility, visible to the public, at all times.

1 11. The medical marijuana facility shall not allow on-site consumption of marijuana,
2 marijuana-infused products or other intoxicants on the premises at any given time.

- 12. The medical marijuana facility shall not have outdoor seating areas other than break areas for employees of the facility.
- 13. The medical marijuana facility shall not have a sign unless it is a medical marijuana dispensary. Signage at medical marijuana dispensaries shall comply with Article XIII of the UDO.
  - 14. Any and all cultivation, processing, storage, display, sales or other distribution of marijuana at a medical marijuana facility shall occur within an enclosed building and shall not be visible from the exterior of the building. If said facility is located outdoors, then the facility shall not be readily visible, and any outdoor area shall be enclosed and topped by a razor-wire fence. Said fence shall be slatted or other privacy-type fence used, and all fencing shall be at least ten (10) feet in height, not including the razor wire.
  - 15. A medical marijuana facility shall comply with the relevant zone district height, area, design and setback requirements and the following additional location restrictions: No medical marijuana facility shall be located within 1,000 feet of any then-existing elementary or secondary school, child day-care center, church or place of worship or public park.
  - 16. A medical marijuana facility, other than a medical marijuana transportation facility, shall be located in a permanent building and shall not be located in a trailer, cargo container, or motor vehicle and the structure shall not be mobile or

operate from a transitory location. A medical marijuana transportation	facility
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- 2 shall follow the rules and restrictions set forth in the Revised Statutes of Missouri,
- 3 the Code of State Regulations and any other associated rules and regulations
- 4 promulgated by the State of Missouri.
- 5 17. Nothing in the UDO restricts multiple permit holders or a single entity owning
- 6 multiple permits from operating from a single physical location, so long as all
- 7 permit requirements are met, and each individual activity is properly licensed.
- 8 18. The Planning and Zoning Commission and/or County Council may include any
- 9 additional conditions it finds necessary to conserve and promote the public health,
- safety, and welfare.
- 19. No retail distribution or sales of medical marijuana-infused products may occur at
- a medical marijuana-infused product manufacturing facility.
- 20. All necessary permits, including a Floodplain Development Permit shall be
- obtained prior to commencement of any construction/remodeling activity at the
- site.
- 16 <u>Section 2</u>. The zoning map of Jefferson County, Missouri shall be amended
- 17 by changing the area where said real estate is located on the map with the marking
- 18 "CU20027".
- 19 Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE IV, CHAPTERS 400 AND 401 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, MISSOURI: UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDER; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, on April 2, 2008, the County Commission of the County of Jefferson, Missouri approved and adopted the Unified Development Order of Jefferson County, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, on December 29, 2010, the Jefferson County, Missouri, Council enacted Ordinance Number 10-0419 codifying the Ordinances of Jefferson County, Missouri, including the Unified Development Order; and

WHEREAS, upon enactment of Ordinance Number 10-0419, the Unified Development Order became codified as Title IV, Chapter 400 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson County, Missouri; and

**WHEREAS,** amendments have been prepared to Title IV, Chapters 400 and 401 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson County, Missouri: Unified Development Order; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of Jefferson County, Missouri, following a public hearing, notice of which was given pursuant to the laws of the State of Missouri, adopted Resolution 8-8-2019A, recommending that the Jefferson County, Missouri, Council adopt proposed amendments to the Unified Development Order; and

**WHEREAS**, at its meeting on November 12, 2019, the Jefferson County, Missouri, Council approved a motion to send the proposed amendments "back to the Planning and Zoning Commission for further evaluation and approval by the Commission"; and

**WHEREAS**, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a meeting on June 25, 2020 at which the Commission further evaluated the proposed amendments and approved them through the adoption of Resolution 6-25-2020A; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution 6-25-2020A of the Planning and Zoning Commission and the proposed amendments were forwarded to the Jefferson County, Missouri, Council along with the full record of the June 25, 2020 meeting on July 1, 2020; and

**WHEREAS,** the Jefferson County, Missouri, Council, having reviewed Resolution 6-25-2020A and the proposed amendments, finds that it is in the best interests of the County to amend the Unified Development Order.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE JEFFERSON COUNTY, MISSOURI, COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Jefferson County, Missouri, Council hereby accepts the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission as memorialized in Resolution 6-25-2020A of the Planning and Zoning Commission of Jefferson County, Missouri, said Resolution having been adopted by the Planning and Zoning Commission on June 25, 2020 following a public hearing held on August 8, 2019 and a second meeting on June 25, 2020 to further evaluate and approve the amendments as mandated by the County Council.

Section 2. The Jefferson County, Missouri, Council hereby approves and adopts proposed amendments to Title IV, Chapters 400 and 401 of the Code of Ordinances of Jefferson County, Missouri: Unified Development Order, said amendments being incorporated by this reference as if fully set out herein and set forth in the attached Exhibit "A".
