Where can I find the results and data from the independent(not the companies that own the towers) studies that prove the new 5G radiation towers being installed throughout the county are not harmful to humans or the environment. Per the FIOA, this information should be readily available, yet I cannot find it anywhere. These companies were allowed to install the millimeter EMF emitting towers without any approval from county residents. I could not find where they were allowed per zoning rules so our elected decision makers were subverted also. With no official approval that I can find, these companies at will installed these weapons in our backyards and next to our schools and remain in service completely unregulated by the county, state, or federal government. I graduated from Rolla over 20 years ago with a degree in electrical engineering and I am putting you on notice that these weapons are extremely harmful to humans, animals, insects, and plants and must all be powered off immediately. These poison emitters should be treated no different than a landfill with regards to zoning. The health and safety of residents are considered when zoning a landfill, why aren't the 5G polluting towers managed the same way? If someone's grass gets too tall or they have a bucket of standing water a nosey neighbor can call the county and the situation must be remediated by the homeowner for the greater good of the community. That makes sense. What doesn't make sense is why a giant telecom company can transmit harmful EMF onto my property and my county officials aren't posting a notice on their front door. My guess is that were given false or misleading information regarding the safety from the telecom company.

The health effects of radiation poisoning are very similar to flu/COVID symptoms. To be more specific, the symptoms of radiation poisoning typically include nausea, vomiting headaches, decreased immune response, fatigue, fever, loss of appetite, abdominal pain, dizziness, headache, and decreased level of consciousness. My wife and I were experiencing several of these symptoms. I took measurements that were above the safe levels of EMF as published by IEEE. Wouldn't it be an interesting experiment to see if COVID cases decrease after the 5G millimeter radiation is shutdown. Our county council would be heroes and role models for discovering this connection and taking firm action to protect their constituents.

Now that you are on notice that the 5G towers are causing significant harm will you have them disabled immediately?

Besides immediately shutting them off, they need to be permanently removed. The purpose of the towers is not justified and will not be of any benefit to county residents. We do not need or want faster internet speeds. If we need more data bandwidth then the telecom companies can install proven safe fiber optic networks. The only purpose for higher data flow I have discovered is that they are being installed to establish a high data surveillance system. We do not have high crime rates thanks to the amazing men and women in local law enforcement, therefore we do not want or need such a drastic measure. Also, this surveillance system is a violation of our constitutional rights. The companies installing these EMF weapons are making many of us sick for a technology that we do not want or need. Please explain what you will do to mitigate this hazard right now live during this meeting. Please do not proceed with the meeting until you answer this question. "Circling back to us" is not an acceptable answer. You all work for us and answer to us. If you were not aware that this problem was occurring because you are not electrical engineers, then that is an understandable answer. However, now that you are put on notice that this problem exists what are you going to do about it? Are you going to let some of your residents continue to get radiated? This could be making your loved ones sick also. We can accept that answer that you are not experts in this field and that you were duped just like we all were, however your actions now that you have been made aware of this significant danger is what we all will be paying attention to. Disabling and removal of the radiation weapons is the only acceptable solution. How quickly you can make this happen will show us your character and how much you care about us. Doing nothing or any response that tries to justify leaving them in service is not acceptable and this matter will get elevated quickly if action is not taken quickly. If the telecom companies have a problem, then power them down immediately, and discuss at a later date if they can prove that they are not close enough cause harm. I can tell you right now that I have personally recorded harmful levels from the one right outside my window. I felt the symptoms and I measured the strength of the field.
